# The Delicate Art of Compassion

Be happy with those who are happy, and weep with those who weep.

### 1. Be compassionate because Jesus was compassionate.

May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ be blessed! He is the compassionate Father and God of all comfort. He's the one who comforts us in all our trouble so that we can comfort other people who are in every kind of trouble. # 2. Show compassion even when you think they don't deserve it.

For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found." So they began to celebrate.

# 3. Healthy compassion recognizes our own brokenness.

## 4. Your compassion needs boundaries.
